

The Higher Public Health Research Center of Valencia Region Premieres its New Corporate Portal

The Higher Public Health Research Center (*Centro Superior de Investigación de la Salud Pública: CSISP*) has turned to the technology multinational GMV for renewal of its portal

Madrid, 14 July 2009. CSISP is the research center brokered by the Public Health Board (*Dirección General de Salud Pública*) of the Regional Government of Valencia. Its main remit is to improve the population's health and welfare levels by dint of technological innovation and research applied to the public healthcare field.

GMV has developed the Center's new portal, meeting all the client's requisites. The CSISP asked for a tool developed under J2EE specs, i.e., allowing new services to be developed and phased in with other information systems and environments. It also had to display and publish its contents in a user-friendly way and cope with several different languages. GMV has built up the new portal from the Liferay tool and the J2EE EJB application server based on open source software for creating on-line collaborative environments.

One of the main aims of the project was to endow each research group with its own maintenance and updating autonomy within each region.

As well as the corporate portal, GMV developed two new independent communities for CSISP's research networks, namely the Food-Safety Research Platform and the Valencia Biobank Network.

GMV has a wealth of experience in portal implementation and consultancy, enabling it to choose in each case the technological architecture best suited to each client's particular needs.

GMV is a privately owned Spanish technology group founded in 1984 and trading on a worldwide scale in the following sectors: Aerospace, Defense and Security, Transport, Telecommunications and IT for public administration and large corporations. In 2008 it chalked up a revenue of 91,8 million euros and more than 1000 employees. The company's growth strategy is based on continual innovation; 10% of its turnover is plowed back into R&D.
